# 17th Annual Taste of Soul Family Festival

The popular event makes a dramatic and impactful return to the 'Shaw!

The 17th Annual Taste of Soul Family Festival (TOS) returned with a dramatic flourish as thousands of people filled Crenshaw Blvd., from Obama Blvd. to Stocker St., to enjoy the incredible culture of South Los Angeles.

The free daylong event, held Oct. 15 from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., attracted a huge multicultural crowd to celebrate the diverse food, music and other elements rooted in the Black American experience. First presented in 2005 by founder/ creator Danny J. Bakewell, Sr., TOS has grown to become a popular destination site as well one of the largest economic generators in Southern California.

"The evolution of Taste of Soul has simply been about the care for Black people and wanting the best for our community," said Bakewell. "I'm simply overwhelmed at the response of our people who returned in big numbers after a three-year absence - to support the biggest block party in all of Los Angeles!"

Among the highlights at TOS were four concert stages, high school and college bands, free health services, technical/digital booths and more than 300 vendors. For example, Los Angeles County hosted its major departments under one, long booth, giving visitors a one-stop shop

## Confronting the Shifting Color of Racism: Resisting the Tyranny of Another Majority

The recent revelation of the racist rant, irrational reasoning and inequitable reordering of the political map of Los Angeles by a group of Latina/o city council and labor leaders offers useful insights and lessons in racial, racialized and racist sentiments, thought and practice in American politics, regardless of the local and Latino context in which it occurred.

Certainly, we who know them personally and politically from other contexts and times, and have worked to build Black/Brown alliances and support Latino interests even when they were small in number, share the shock of discovering they could be so crude, cruel and crassly racist in language and zero-sum conceptions of political planning and practice. But we are compelled by the undeniable evidence to accept that their personal positions are grossly different from their public self-presentations.

Likewise, we must not rush to confuse members of the Latino political elite for the whole of the Mexican or Latino community. Nor must we deny or diminish the reality of anti-Black racism, and anti-Native American colorism within the Latino community. For again, regardless of its Latino expression in this context, in a larger sense and understanding, this racism and colorism are interrelated and linked as a reflection and reality of American

Indeed, in both form and substance, this tawdry and telling racist performance is America in miniature, vintage racist Americana without the virus mask to shield us and disguise them. Thus, this recent revelation and the ongoing reality of anti-Black racism and anti-Indigenous colorism raises confront the shifting color of racism in L.A. and the country as a whole and to increase our resistance to the existing racist tyranny of the majority and the emerging tyranny of another majority.

Clearly, we, like every other organization, institution or person of conscience and commitment to a just, good, equitable and inclusive society, are morally compelled to condemn unreservedly this vitriolic, vile and vicious session, reeking with racist language and illogic, and evidencing an unrelenting callous disregard for the dignity, rights and rightful interests of African Americans and Native Americans. Indeed, even the Black child was not spared racism's hatred, hatefulness and hostility, for racism allows no such humane exceptions. And the rant and co-signing in silence or in open reaffirmation left no ground for anyone of them to claim innocence or a lesser degree of

Let us then, strongly praise the rapid response of the people, united across racial lines with African Americans and Indigenous peoples at the center, demanding and forcing the resignation of the ring leader, former council president Nury Martinez, and the labor leader Ron Hernandez of the L.A. County Federation of Labor, whose presence and participation demonstrated some of the problems facing Black people in terms of political representation and Black workers within and without unions, i.e., equity in employment, contracts and leadership.

And the struggle must continue to remove the other two offending council members, Gil Cedillo and

Kevin de León, in the interest of the people to repair the wound and breach and to continue to move toward the just, good and equitable city and society we all want, struggle for and deserve. For it was not simply the social savagery of the racist language of which they are all guilty, but also the evidence of their real practice and intention of turning this hatred and hostility into public policy, following the model and mindset of our common oppressor.

Thus, here we must expand our understanding of racism which expresses itself as imposition (violence on every level), ideology (justification of the system and its rulers), and institutional arrangements (structures, processes, policies and practices to promote and perpetuate the imposition and ideology). Our position once was that people of color in this country could not be racist because they did not have the sys-

temic power to impose. But in systems of oppression, there are always perpetuators, collaborators and victims. And although the collaborators do not have original power, they can and do have derivative power, power derived from the system, and thus are able to impose, justify and use institutional arrangements to oppress vulnerable victims in ways authorized, encouraged and supported

by the system. Now, Whites are still dominant, but as Latinos become a majority, they can either continue to join us and others oppressed and equitable and inclusive society or they can simply seek a comfortable and collaborating place in the system of White supremacy, acting as agents and junior oppressors in a system that still oppresses them and their people. Our righteous and relentless struggle as a people has been against the tyranny of the majority, a White majority, and we cannot and will not accept the tyranny of another ma-

By tyranny we mean the evil, unjust and oppressive rule of the majority, especially under the camouflage and cover of democracy. Indeed, Haji Malcolm defined this democracy as essentially "disguised hypocrisy," a claiming and gaming with seductive words and suppressive deeds. As we have noted before, it is not a real democracy but a "herrenvolk democracy," a masterrace democracy, in which the ruling race/class practices it for themselves in various ways and imposes tyranny on others different and vulnerable.

It justifies itself by mystifying and magnifying the meaning of numbers. But we know from history and daily experience, the majority are not always right, rational, just or respectful of the dignity, rights, needs and aspirations of the minority. Indeed, from the beginning, the White majority and its ruling race/class has been, not only unjust, but also genocidal, enslaving, holocaust-creating, segregationist, suppressive, repressive and oppressive in various other ways against Native Americans, African Americans, Latina/o Americans and Asian Americans, and others different and vulnerable.

Even with the shifting numbers of the majority, Whites still control the governments and nongovernmental institutions of wealth and power, i.e., corporations, banks, investment firms, the media, commercial and social, and the foundations. So even with a majority of Latinos and/

or peoples of color, we will still have to deal together with structural and systemic White dominance as the South African historical and current situation informs us.

And we cannot do this successfully if Latinos focus on imagined Black power and overlook, excuse and avoid challenging White power and the systemic racism which it established and maintains.

It is in this context of the tyranny of the majority that I have called their racist laws racist hatred and hostility turned into public policy and socially sanctioned practice. These include: the laws and policies to suppress our vote; the gerrymandering of our districts to deny and diminish our communal political power; the legislative, judicial and proposition attacks on Affirmative Action and diversity, equity and inclusive initiatives; police practices as an occupying army, militarized and murderous, acting as both representatives and the reality of the armed majority aggressive and merciless under the color, camouflage and cover of

The critical task before us, then, as always, is to continue our righteous and relentless struggle to be ourselves and free ourselves and expand the realm of freedom, justice, equity and good in this society and world. Within this overarching historic and ongoing initiative, we must continue to demand and struggle for the resignations of the two hold-out councilmen; support and monitor the urgent investigation of the redistricting plan and call for the rejection of the tainted plan and for a new commission reflective of the diversity of peoples and a new plan that is respectful of what is right, just, inclusive and equitable, not just about numbers.

Also, in spite of our sense of betrayal and broken alliance and understandable shock at our allies imitating our common oppressor, we must continue to build and strengthen Black/Brown

coalitions and alliances. Indeed, we must build new, expansive and more inclusive ones, including African Americans, Native Americans, Latina/o Americans and Asian Americans.

Moreover, we have to build intercommunal projects of work and struggle which address the critical issues facing the Black community in this time of transition: equitable employment in the face of employer racial preference and Latino kinship and ethnic networks; adequate union support for securing equity in work, contracts and leadership; negotiating neighborhood transitions and issues of space, place, and quality relations; and equity and justice in political representation, public resource distribution and education.

Finally, we must continue to rebuild and build the Black Liberation Movement, a societal movement of all oppressed, struggling and progressive people and an international movement to redraw the political map of L.A. and America, and create conditions that provide just and equitable space, power and resources for all, regardless of name or number, color or imposed condition of life.

And as always, we must constantly be attentive to the well-being of the world and all in it, for as our honored ancestor, Nana Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, taught us "We must remake the world. The task is nothing less than that."


As I prepared my body start chemotherapy, I



## 'Mental Imprisonment-The Constipated Mind' 'Baby On The Run

In or about 1571 B.C. The Pharaoh of Egypt seemingly was an "angry madman." He had just come into power. It was then the Hebrews (Exodus 12:40) tells us, "Now the sojourning of the children of Israel (who dwelt in Egypt) was four hundred and thirty years. The two reckonings of the sojourning: one starting from the "promise" to Abraham (Galatians 3:14,17=430 years, the other starting from the recognition of his "seed" (Isaac) Genesis 21:12 (Acts 7:8 and Genesis 15:13-15=400 years.

"This "dwelling" in Egypt was only 215 years and is to be distinguished from the "sojourning", which was another 215 years." (Companion Bible) were truly enslaved for about 215 years and they sojourned in Egypt about 215 years before then. That makes up the 430 years that we read about. They were not enslaved a full 430 years, because----remember the other Pharaoh who was in power when Jacob and his family came was friendly. When the new Pharaoh took power, it was that one started enslaving the He-

brews because they were producing offspring abundantly, and he thought they would take over. He, therefore felt he had to do something to stop them. It is here that we find "Baby On the Run." There are other details, but this information will help guide us. You will recall that Joseph had supervision as governor over all the grain and foodstuffs over Egypt because of the famine and he was most trustworthy and wise. This was under the friendly Pharaoh. Joseph's family with Jacob, the patriarchal head of the twelve tribes, had

journeyed to Egypt because of the severe famine. Before coming to Egypt, Joseph's eleven brothers had treated him badly, kidnaped him and left him for dead. Jacob had sent them (the eleven) to look for Joseph because they had been gone so long. When the brothers' returned Joseph was not with them. They told their father, Jacob, a BIG lie that he had been attacked by a wild animal and brought back Joseph's bloody royal coat to their father. Don't worry. Jehovah is true to His word. For we learn from Exodus (the book of Redemption) Exodus 2:6 that when baby Moses was in his ark, the babe wept. Pharaoh's daughter looked in and heard the babe weeping and she felt compassion on the Hebrew babe. "In that little ark lay, when she opened it she saw the child. At three months old, he was already sort of a fugitive. In that little ark lay 1 the defeat of the enemy,2 the preservation of the Nation, 3 the faithfulness of Jehovah's word, 4 the bringing to naught "the wisdom of Egypt" and 5 the coming of "the seed of the woman" Genesis 3:15. "Throughout the long history, we see visibly and behind the scenes Joseph's sad, but successful

life. However, not all was lost. As is the history of Jehovah, he consistently reminds us, "I am the LORD." He says, "beside me there is no god." "I will never leave you or forsake you." "Be not afraid." These are His signatures of comfort to memorize and keep in our hearts. Now, let's get back to the story-account. The baby Moses starts his life as what I termed, "Baby On The Run." He was born through Divine faith" covering him. When he was born, his mother, Jochebed, saw "by faith" he was a beautiful child." One might say she knew there was something very special about their child. The "evil" Pharaoh had given orders to kill all the boys born, the "firstborn." The midwives would not kill the baby boys and bravely went against the Pharaoh's commands. Jehovah rewarded them for their faithfulness. Exodus 1:14-22. Vs 21 tells us, "And it came to pass, because the midwives feared God, that He made them houses. And Pharaoh charged all the people, saying "Every son that is "born you shall cast into the river and every daughter you shall save alive.' This is the atmosphere wherein Moses was born. As Moses grew

up in luxury in the Egyptian surroundings, he prospered intellectually, learning, reading, mathematics and other learned subjects. During these forty years that he spent in Pharaoh's canopy, he saw the mistreatment of the Hebrews. It sounds like he had anger built up inside of him, because he decided one day to kill an Egyptian when the Egyptian was mistreating the Hebrew. He was not understanding that Jehovah had not given him the word yet to start his ministry/mission. Realizing that he was now hunted by Pharaoh, he ran away. He married Zipporah and spent an extended 40 years with Jethro. His father-in law. The time came when he thought he should return to Egypt after hearing from the LORD (Exodus 4:19). And the LORD said unto Moses in Midian, "go, return into Egypt: for all the men are dead which sought your life." This sounds familiar doesn't it. Remember the account of Mary and Joseph. The LORD then starts giving Moses' instructions of what he expected of him. Moses' mind had been in what I have called here, "Mental Imprisonment." He had eighty years behind

# Black Lives Matter Camps 24/7 at Disgraced Councilmember's Home

Black Lives Matter Los Angeles (BLMLA) has pitched their tents in front of disgraced Los Angeles Councilmember Kevin De León's Eagle Rock home. This is in response to his refusal to step down and resign after audio leaked of a conversation he was a part of where he anti-Black statements and seemingly conspired to dilute Black political power disenfranchise Black voters in the 10th Council District.

De León, L.A. Council President Nury Martinez, Councilmember Cedillo, and Los Angeles Labor Federation leader Ron Herrera were participants in a conversation in October 2021 about city redistricting in which multiple racist remarks were made. In that same conversation, De León conspired to gerrymander Councilmember Nithya Raman's district.

Herrera and Martinez have resigned, while Cedillo and De León show no signs of resigning anytime soon. On Saturday, Oct. 15, 8

p.m., BLMLA, joined by other community groups, showed up in front of De León's Eagle Rock home, intent on staying until he resigned. They sang and danced to "Ease on Down the Road" from "The Wiz" -- a reference to De León's recorded comments that Black political power is like "the Wizard of Oz effect." De León complained that it seems like there are more Blacks shouting than there actually are in numbers - a jab at the declining numbers of Blacks in Los Angeles.

Sunday morning, the groups continued the protest, under the watchful eye of nearby LAPD officers, by playing "The Color Purple's" "Maybe God is Trying to Tell You Something" along with other popular Black gospel

Throughout the day on Sunday, Oct. 15, De León's neighbors showed support for the protestors--even providing food.

A large group of Latino De León supporters showed up in the afternoon but, after a conversation with

BLMLA leaders, switched sides and joined in the calls for De León Leon to resign.

community leaders, clubs have Democratic volunteered to sponsor meals for the group, BLMLA.

"De León participated in a meeting that was not only hurtful but harmful to the Black community," explained BLMLA cofounder Melina Abdullah who spent the night in front of his house on Saturday night.

"He colluded undermine Black political power and Black community and he has to be held accountable. He's run from us at city hall so we'll protest against him wherever we can find him. We're going to camp out in front of his house until he leaves the City Council."

I spent hours researching the many ugly truths about my diagnosis, and the grim

Black women are 41% more likely to die from breast cancer than white women and experience the lowest 5-year survival rate of any race or ethnicity. ## Biden and Bass Tout Local Jobs Created from Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill

On Thursday, October 13, President Joe Biden and Congresswoman and mayoral candidate Karen Bass visited the site of the future Metro Purple Line stop at the VA Medical Center in Los Angeles and spoke about the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, also known as the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

Joining Biden and Bass were Sen. Alex Padilla, Mayor Eric Garcetti and Reps. Maxine Waters, Nanette Barragán, Ted Lieu, and Brad Sherman.

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law is the largest long-term investment in infrastructure in nation's history. It provides \$550 billion per year through 2026 for updating transportation including improving public safety and climate resilience. Grants can be awarded to projects across a broad swath of infrastructure including maritime, aviation, highways, and rail-

our infrastructure - literally, not figuratively since the Interstate Highwav System built by Dwight D. Eisenhower."

Section 25019(a) of the law allows recipients of grants to "implement a local or other geographical

including pre-hire agreements, subject to any applicable state and local laws, policies, and procedures."

"The local hire provision that we passed and that the President signed into law, allows local transportation agencies like L.A. Metro to prioritize the hiring of local Angelenos for projects that are taking place in their own backyard," said Bass.

The Purple line extension runs from Koreatown, through Beverly Hills and Century City, to the Westwood VA hospital.

"A trip from Koreatown to the VA campus, which now takes over an hour on a bus — sometimes longer than that — it's going to shrink to 25 minutes on rail," said Biden. "Plus, this project is a job creator. More than 100,000 workers union workers — more than 100,000 workers hard at work on the entire Purple Line extension, all three sections."

Other projects benefiting from the Infrastructure Law include the electrification of Los Angeles' bus fleet by 2030, upgrading the electrical grid and internet, increasing lanes at the Port of Los Angeles, upgrades to Los Angeles International Airport, replacing lead pipes and expanding water recycling.

More than 350 projects already been announced across California. Many of the projects in Los Angeles are targeted to be complete by the time the city hosts the 2028 Olympics.

President Biden pointed out that Republicans "who voted against the Infrastructure Bill, called me and the bill "socialist" and then attacked — Democrats who passed it — "socialist," "radical spending," "rushed," and "irresponsible." now they're quietly and privately sending letters to my administration asking for money. They're talking about how important projects are in their districts and for all Americans. Well, guess what? I'm going to give them the money because it's not about them, it's about the

people they represent."

## Black Republicans Running for Congress Hope their Campaigns Lead to More Black Votes for GOP

The Republican Party has found it hard to convince Black Californians to join them. But for Black Republican candidates running for Congress in California, it's about running winning campaigns, which means getting voters to accept the Republican Party platform.

What that platform is, however, depends on which Republican you ask.

Republican Joe Collins III is hoping that the second time is a charm. A 13year Navy veteran, who spent his early years in South Central LA, Collins ran against Maxine Waters for her Congressional seat in 2020. Now he is running against Ted Lui to represent California's 36th Congressional district after making it onto the November 8 ballot with 14% of the vote well behind Lui's 66%.

Collins sees the race as a referendum on both parties. He asserts that the Democratic party, which has controlled much of California for the last few decades, has failed Black constituents. He believes the ideologies of the Republican party are more



"We don't have a lot of people that are Black that are in the Republican Party speaking to the everyday stuff of Black America, it just doesn't happen," says Collins.

Craig De Luz, a longtime Republican advisor in California, explains that more is needed than just trying to get African Americans to register as Republicans. It is about getting them to see the Republican platform as aligned with their own values. De Luz. and other Black Republicans are trying to reframe their political positions to correspond with those val-

For De Luz and Collins, how a person votes at the end of the day is what is important.

The idea that neither party has performed well for its members is a distinct part of the pitch that Black Republicans are trying to make. Pastor Brian Hawkins' website expresses his views upfront in the motto, "We the People vs the Establishment."

Hawkins is the Republican on the November ballot in the race to represent California's 25th Congressional district. He advanced through his primaries with 16.4% of the vote and will face Democrat Raul Ruiz who received 56.4%, according to Ballotpedia.

Hawkins served on the Jacinto city council. He also served time in prison during his youth. According to Hawkins, he chose to turn his ten years in prison into an opportunity to change his life. He created mentorship programs to help other inmates. His unique background echoes

The program is the first opportunity for students to earn support fir college in a state service program.

"I decided to apply because I am pursuing a career in education and #CaliforniansForAll College Corps is a way for me to earn as I learn," said Tia Rowe, a College Corps Felple together."

Rowe, along with other College Corps fellows, will take part in community service projects across the state. Fryday said College Corps is an opportunity to "begin a life of service" to benefit the masses. The program is a collaboration of over 600 community organizations, including 46 partnering colleges and universities across the state.

The objective is to address issues pertaining to

finish their assignments, they stand to receive \$7,000 for 450 hours of community service. An additional \$3,000 is provided as an education award.

"You and I are going to be part of a movement toward change," Rowe said before the oath was administered in the auditorium of the California Natural Resources Agency Building. "We're going into our own communities and playing an active role in building them up."

College Corps represents the first and largest state-level investment in a college service program in the country, with \$146 million earmarked for up to 6,500 students over the next two years. About 80% of fellows are students of color, 58 % are first-generation college students, 68% are Pell-Grant eligible, and 500 fellows are eligible for AB 540 Dream Act.

A virtual briefing hosted by Ethnic Media Services and California Black Media was held on Oct. 11 featuring Fryday, President and CEO of FIND Food Bank Debbie S. Espinosa, and student fellows. The discussion centered around the vision that inspired the program, how it works, who is eligible, how to apply, and where students will do their community service.

"This is a win-win-win: Helping to pay for college, gaining valuable work experience, and having a meaningful impact on your community," Fryday stated.



## Pandemic or Not, We Need **More COVID-19 Preparedness**

President Biden declared the pandemic is over, then quickly backtracked. Unfortunately, premature choice undermines the ongoing efforts to prepare the country for future outbreaks. Even before the statement, Congress denied funding to prepare America for the next outbreak.

However, Coronavirus scenarios from multiple research teams acknowledge that a new variant could once again increase the size and severity of the anticipated late fall surge in the United States.


Now is the time to increase our readiness. Instead, we're dismantling our ability to monitor the spread of variants.

#### Surveillance Undermined

We have the data to confirm that about 400 people die daily from the virus, and up to 23 million Americans are living with long COVID. However, we've lost track of how many people are infected at any given time.

The shift to at-home testing caused the volume of gold-standard PCR tests to plummet, eliminating access to data needed to detect new variants, inform residents and prepare our medical infrastructure.

Without preparedness funding, our country lacks the testing capacity needed during an outbreak. During the Omicron variant surge, laboratories struggled to handle tens of millions of additional tests, leading to results that took as long as 10 days. The inefficiencies

of directing the majority of diagnostic tests to a few centralized laboratories rippled through healthcare system.

We are in an even worse position now than when Omicron arrived. Today, U.S. laboratories can only process 62 million PCR tests a month, half of the capacity we had this spring. Production of athome test kits continues to drop with waning demand. Yet, when variants appear, manufacturing capacity cannot ramp up as quickly as the need, resulting in empty shelves.

#### Access Denied

Testing is the gateway to antiviral treatments, which are most effective if administered in the early days of infection. However, access to testing continues to be reduced.

When Congress rebuffed the White House's request for \$22.5 billion in additional COVID funding in March, programs that our country's

the pandemic shut down.

First, the \$18 billion Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Uninsured Program was shuttered due to lack of funding, ending universal access to PCR testing.

Worksite Labs witnessed immediate impact at our community sites, where 98% of visitors lack insurance. At our South Los Angeles community site, residents can access PCR tests processed onsite within 24 hours, vaccinations and free medical screenings. As soon as an out-of-pocket cost was associated with the PCR test, the number of residents who sought testing dwindled from an average of 100 people per


day to just three per day. Last month, the free athome antigen test program was suspended. Now, many of the roughly 26 million uninsured individuals in the United States may forgo testing altogether. without testing, our neediest populations relinquish access that treatments could prevent hospitalization.

Whether you think the pandemic is over or not, now is the time to build a better laboratory testing system and ensure everyone has access to the testing they need – when they need



> Friday, Assemblymember Bryan told California Black Media (CBM) "I'm inspired by the solidarity we've seen across communities, across race, class, geography and even political boundaries. We've got city elected officials, state elected officials, county elected officials all the way up to the Senator for California, Sen. Padilla and the President of the United States have not only chosen to engage in this conversation, but to call for justice in these resignations, call for accountability in his resignation.

> "I'm inspired by that, and I think it shows a lot of potential for the future," he continued. "But I'm also a little bit frustrated and still kind of healing from the fact that de Leon and Cedillo have refused to accept accountability, and the idea that they would show up to that council meeting [Tuesday] I think was a display of complete disregard for the people and a bit of arrogance quite frankly."

> Council member Bonin tested positive for COVID, so next week's Tuesday and Wednesday meetings will be held in an online format.

> Acting Council President Mitch O'Farrell's (District 13) office said in a statement to CBM, "It would not be appropriate for Council members De León and Cedillo to attend regardless of the meeting format. Their failure to resign cannot indefinitely interfere with the council's ability to conduct the

people's business. They need to do the right thing and resign."

In addition to the outrage about the racist comments in the conversation, the release of the tapes has drawn scrutiny to the redistricting process itself. California Attorney General Rob Bonta announced on Wednesday that the California Department of Justice has launched an investigation into the Los Angeles City Council Redistricting Process.

"It seems like it's way too political process here in the city of Los Angeles and it should be more independent and as Chair of the Assembly Elections Committee, it's something that I want to look at, to see if there's a role for the state to increase the fairness and the efficacy and the impartiality of this process," Bryan told CBM.

A spokesperson for

O'Farrell told "Councilmember O'Farrell has introduced a major charter reform measure, that would go before the voters, with the intention of expanding the number of city council districts, thereby increasing representation. If that were to pass, there would

be an associated special redistricting that would need to take place.

On Tuesday's Council agenda is an item about forming an independent redistricting commission for the city. O'Farrell is very eager to discuss and vote on this item."

"De León's Cedillo's refusal to resign is another deep wound they're inflicting on us all. Let Los Angeles heal. Resign today," Bonin tweeted.

City Councilmembers De León and Cedilla did not respond to CBM's requests for comments.



### South Carolina women unanimous No. 1 in preseason AP Top 25

Dawn Staley and South Carolina picked up right where they left off: No. 1 in The Associated Press Top 25 women's basketball poll.

The defending national champion Gamecocks were the unanimous choice of the 30-member national media panel in the preseason poll released Tuesday. It's the third consecutive season South Carolina is the preseason favorite.

"This is where we wanted to be and envisioned for

our program," Staley said. "I got to give it to our players. We constantly get some of the best players in the country. They put us in this position as they work extremely hard. I don't know if they come in and say i want to be the No. 1 team in the country, but they do say they want to be national champions. This is a step to being a national champion."

Stanford, Texas, Iowa and Tennessee round out the top five teams in the preseason poll. It is Iowa's best ranking since 1994

when the Hawkeyes were also fourth in midseason.

"It makes no difference in March what we're ranked in October, but certainly I want my team to have confidence and be proud of what they've accomplished. Iowa is on the map," coach Lisa Bluder said. "We'll celebrate it and then forgot about it."

South Carolina went wire-to-wire as the No. 1 team last year and have been the top team for 20 straight weeks. Only UConn (four times) and Baylor (once) have had longer streaks at No. 1 since the 1994-95 season when the Top 25 became a writers' poll.

The Huskies are ranked No. 6, the first time since 2006 that they weren't in the first five in the preseason poll. Louisville, Iowa State, Notre Dame and N.C. State finish off the top 10.

#### HOLD THAT TIGER

Princeton has its first preseason ranking, coming in at No. 24.

The Tigers were ranked for the final two weeks of last season and return four starters from the team that pulled off one of the biggest upsets in NCAA Tournament, upending Kentucky in the first round before falling to Indiana by a point in the next game.

"It's great for our program and for the Ivv League and putting some respect on what we've done in the past," coach Carla Berube said. "I think it's tremendous for our team and for us to live up to

the standards we've set, Flanery said.


